General Rules and Regulations

22.52 AGATE, ELBERT, MATHESON, & PEYTON LIGHTING RATE

APPLICABILITY

Applicable for street lighting service in Agate, Elbert, Matheson, and Peyton, Colorado, based on existing boundaries and petitions currently on file with the Association, and only until the time of incorporation of the areas.

AVAILABILITY

Available only to the above listed areas for lighting streets, alleys, and parks for unmetered photoelectric controlled lighting fixture at standard available voltage.

RATE PER MONTH

175 W HID Fixture	\$19.55
40 W LED Fixture	\$19.55

EXTENSION, MAINTENANCE, AND RELOCATION

The Association, at its sole discretion and in accordance with sound engineering practices, will erect, build and maintain, under normal wear and tear, the fixtures, poles, wiring and lamps used to render service under this rate.

Street lighting service will be provided only in such areas where the population density justifies service hereunder and in which there are sufficient electric members of the Association to justify, at the sole discretion of the Association, the installation of a minimum of five (5) street lights in a manner so as to render adequate street lighting for the area on the basis of an average of not less than four (4) members per street light. The members located within the area receiving such service will be billed equally in multiples of five (5) cents in order to produce a monthly revenue to the Association equal to that of the cost of the rates.

A general consensus of the affected members within an existing boundary, following thirty (30) days' written notice to such members of a proposed change including any financial impact, will dictate the installation, removal, or relocation of street lighting service.

Members requesting street lighting to be mounted on poles other than wood approved by Mountain View Electric Association Inc. (MVEA) or requesting underground outdoor lighting distribution systems will be required to pay the Association, as non-refundable contribution, an amount equal to the difference between the estimated cost of the requested system and that of the standard wood pole and overhead construction. In any event, all facilities will be installed, owned, operated, and maintained by the Association.

The Association will not be required to replace or repair broken lamps or fixtures when such breakage is due to excessive willful or negligent acts other than the Association's.

The expense of moving or relocating the fixtures after initial installations will be borne by the member.

NOTIFICATION OF MALFUNCTIONS

It is the responsibility of the incorporated municipalities, homeowner's associations, and special districts to notify the Association of burned-out lamps or any improper operation of the fixture. Repairs will be scheduled during regular working hours of the Association as set forth in the Rules and Regulations.

TERMS OF PAYMENT

The above rates are net, due, and payable on or before the date stated on the bill. If not paid on or before this date, a late charge of 2% per month or \$5.00 per month, whichever is greater, will apply; service will be discontinued as determined by Rules and Regulations 12.0 Discontinuance of Service.

TAXES, FEES, ETC.

Any tax, franchise fee, or other similar charge, however denominated, will be recovered by a surcharge only upon those members receiving service within the boundaries of the district and/or municipality imposing such tax or fee.
